Here's What's Happening at Green Bay Austin Straubel International Airport

Flying to AirVenture? Clear for free at GRB!

The EAA is gearing up for another big [AirVenture](#) – and that means it will also be busy at GRB! EAA's annual AirVenture, which takes place July 24-30, is the world's largest fly-in gathering, and one of the world's largest aviation events. Attendance averages 500,000 and a significant number of those attendees fly to the event in their own planes. That means plenty of business for nearby airports like GRB.

“We’ll easily see as many as 450 aircraft fly into GRB during the course of AirVenture because of the easy access in and out of our airport, as well as the abundance of available aircraft parking,” explained Tom Miller, Director of Green Bay Austin Straubel International Airport.

For attendees coming from outside the U.S., they can clear [U.S. Customs](#) for free at GRB. With the new International Arrivals Terminal, they simply clear Customs at the International Arrivals Terminal and then park at one of the two [Fixed Base Operators](#) (FBO) ramps: Jet Air and Executive Air. The two FBOs offer a variety of services including fuel and repairs and arrangements for catering, hotel rooms and ground transportation.



Speed through security with TSA Pre-check event

Whether you travel a few times a year or every week, [TSA Pre✓®](#) can make your travels easier and quicker! If you're enrolled in the expedited screening program, you'll be able to use TSA Pre✓® lanes at 450 security checkpoints at 180 airports nationwide. All of the airlines serving GRB (American, Delta, United) participate in this program. These lanes are generally quicker than the standard lines and you won't have to remove your shoes, belts, jackets, 3-1-1 compliant liquids or electronic devices.

Local travelers can enroll in TSA Pre✓® at a mobile application center that will be open at GRB July 24 – 28. To pre-enroll and arrange your in-person appointment, go to: www.identogo.com/precheck

The mobile application center will be located on the 2nd floor of the main passenger terminal, and does not require the applicant to be a ticketed passenger. Hours of operation will be:

- Monday, July 24; Tuesday, July 25; Wednesday, July 26: 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. and 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- Thursday, July 27 and Friday, July 28: 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and 11:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Larger, Upgraded Aircraft Coming to United Express GRB to ORD Flights

[United Airlines](#) has announced that it will add Embraer [E175](#) aircraft to the United Express schedule at GRB. The new aircraft will replace older, less-efficient 50-seat regional jets on two of the four flights between Green Bay ([GRB](#)) and Chicago O'Hare Airport ([ORD](#)), beginning July 1, 2017.

The new, 76 passenger planes have 12 seats in [United First](#) and 64 seats in [United Economy](#), including 16 extra-legroom [United Economy Plus](#) seats. The aircraft also offers:

- More personal space for customers, with wider seats and aisles than other regional aircraft
- A power outlet at each United First seat
- Large overhead bins that can accommodate standard-size carry-on bags
- Wi-Fi capabilities on E175 aircraft operating as United Express, as well as personal device entertainment
